#### Overview

The recent admission scandal that still threatens to bring down individuals from multiple societal sectors proved to be a blot on the higher education landscape. Although there have long been pay-to-play rumors swirling around some schools, any evidence was anecdotal. However, over the last few months we have been learning more and more about the depth of the deceptions that resulted in some students gaining admission at top-tier schools.

In this webinar, I will provide a brief overview of the situation that authorities uncovered, and then discuss how that affects those of us who work in higher education. Specifically, I will share case studies to help attendees identify ethically questionable issues that we may have already faced, and help participants develop a plan they may use to address any issues moving forward.
